### Chair's Report

Update from CAC chair on upcoming events and news affecting conservation activities

### **KCAC Projects**

Review projects the KCAC is currently working on

#### **Climate Smart Communities (CSC)**

The Climate Smart Communities committee is a working group to assist the town in achieving Climate Smart goals.

The CSC meeting is held monthly on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of the month.

- Kent is confirmed for a \$5K grant from NYSERDA and is currently working on getting the grant into town coffers.
- There will be a kickoff meeting scheduled for sometime in May. Two Vasser alums will be coming to speak to existing Vasser students working on the greenhouse gas inventory project.

#### **Kent Natural Resources Inventory (NRI)**

- Bll Volckmann had discussion with town planning board. A followup meeting is scheduled for May 2nd.
- Bill Volckmann is working to get documents from the Kent historical society to supplement the NRI info.
- Town environmental consultant is on the NRI committee.
- Next step is to finalize the outline of NRI. It should follow the plan already laid out by Hudsonia.

**Biodiversity Inventory Project** 

• Entomologist is staying at Bill Buck's home for two days to count and record insect populations in the area with him.

#### Other CAC projects

- Highlands Trail / North Putnam Greenway trail project with NY/NJ Trail Conference
  - o Currently there is no activity scheduled during the winter months, looking at doing additional trail work with NY/NJ Trail Conference starting in March/April

#### Discussion and review of current Land Development Projects in town

- Discussion regarding proposed changes to the town code to accommodate soil removal, excavation and mining in connection with proposed land development projects in the Town of Kent and the response to the town board from the CAC and Planning Board.
  - o The current moratorium on soil removal and excavation has been extended another six months as of February, 2022.
  - o Planning board had an additional meeting on this on March 28th. Planning board did not agree on revised plan made by consultants.
  - o An additional meeting occurred and mining document was updated by consultants. Mining document will be reviewed again at the next board meeting.
  - o Excavation permits are currently required if disturbing 2 acres of land or more. Currently the planning board wants to retain control of this permitting process.
  - o Currently no permit is required for removal of 750 cubic yards of fill in the proposed planning document RE mining.
- Kent Manor project, a 400 room development for Nichols Street between Horsepound Road and 52 was discussed.

#### Town of Kent CAC hikes and events

The Town of Kent CAC has a wonderful inventory of trails and open spaces available for all types of activities, hiking, bicycling, fishing, hunting, and different field sports activities, all here within the town. The CAC encourages everyone to get out and explore our wonderful outdoors. As part of our work, the CAC holds different outdoor events throughout the year to bring folks together for a fun activity combined with some history of the local town.

#### Planning for new events

  - o Woodcock walk scheduled for April 23rd at 7:30PM at the Great Swamp Wildlife Management Area on Cornwall Hill Road in Patterson, NY.
  - o Hawk Rock trail hike confirmed for May 22nd 2022. Roxanne and Bill will be on this.
