Development Projects in Town of Kent

- There are a few new residential projects plus the planned expansion of the Putnam Nursing and Rehabilitation Center on Ludingtonville Rd.
- Discussed proposed changes to the town code to accommodate soil removal, excavation, and mining in connection with proposed land development projects in the Town of Kent and the response to the town board from the CAC and Planning Board.
 Discussed the concept of requiring development projects to conform to the character of the Town. Kent does not have an architectural Review board.
- Bill V. provided information about previous projects in the town that required DEC mining permits.

Hikes and Events

The La Fontaine family had contacted Bill V. about reinstalling the kiosk from the trailhead on Whangtown Rd. Ideally, it will be reinstalled in April.
