Update on Kent Lakes Association

KCAC Projects

Kent Natural Resources Inventory (NRI)

A grant application to DEC is being prepared to cover costs of the NRI combined with the biodiversity inventory.

Biodiversity Inventory:

Plants will be a very complete survey. Will try to be very complete on some species groups e.g., dragonflies. Field work is ongoing, collecting and processing. Samples will catalogued later on. A graduate student at UCONN is sequencing the DNA of the new fungus.

Other CAC projects

Discussed the "Green Trail" that Gypsy Trail Club had been maintaining running from Whangtown Rd. to the Epstein Farm. This is part of an existing network of trail that has been in place for over 50 years. Representatives from DEP walked the trail with adjacent landowners in April. Gypsy Trail Club would like to develop a loop trail that uses part of the "Green Trail." However, the Club is not in a position to take on the required stewardship and is asking KCAC/Town of Kent to do so. DEP has asked that a stewardship proposal only include the sections walked that day, which would exclude the continuation of the trail down to Schrade Rd. and any proposed additions to make a loop trail. The section from Whangtown through to Schrade is under consideration by the NY NJ Trail Conference as part of the cross-county trail network but is only in the preliminary proposal stage. Concerns were expressed about having a trail terminate on private property. Decided to meet to walk the trail and reach a decision at the next meeting.

Development projects: Chestnut Energy, which has proposed a gas station complex for the former Bob's garage property on Rte. 311, is buying additional land contiguous to the property. They have not yet presented a proposal to the Planning Board.

Soil removal code: A grant application has been submitted to Hudson Valley greenways to help cover the costs of developing the new code.

Astronomy night: postponed due to COVID19 – perhaps could be hosted this summer or early fall. We have reached out to Westchester Astronomers Club as co-hosts. Bill V. will set up some new dates with them in June or September.
