There are Kent jurisdictional wetlands as well as DEC wetlands on or adjacent to the property. Mr. Barber said that it still needs to be ascertained if there is a need for DEC or Kent wetland permits. We are waiting for a determination from the NYS Fish and Wildlife Association to determine if this site is exempt from the prohibition of the cutting season because some of the property is above 900 feet and bats typically do not roost at that elevation. Mr. Barber aid that there are some outsanding items and recommended adjourning the Public Hearing to the August meeting.

# NYCDEP Horsepound Ridge Forest Management Project, Horsepeound Rd., Kent, NY; TM: 33.-1-44, 45 & 33.6-1-71

Mr. Daniel Lawrence, Forester for NYCDEP attended the meeting. This project involves approximately 80 acres to be logged off of Rhinebeck and Horsepound Roads. He spoke to Mr. Othmer, Kent Highway Superintendent, about the project and Mr. Othmer said to keep in touch with him when the project starts.

#### Barber's Comments (memo attached)

There was a Public Hearing scheduled for the July 11, 2019 meeting for this project. Mr. Barber inspected the site with Mr. Lawrence the end of May to confirm the wetland delineations and said there is no need for a wetland permit but an erosion control permit is required. There may not be any cutting from April through November. There was discussion about the trucks traveling down Barrett Hill rather than Horsepound Road because it is in the process of being paved. Some of the drainage improvements on site may help existing drainage problems on site. Mr. Barber stated that Mr. Lawrence had done an excellent job and his submittal was very impressive. Mr. Barber asked Mr. Tolmach to open the Public Hearing for this project.

Ms. Axelson said that there were comments from North East Fire Suppression Associates (attached) and the Planning Board had received a letter from Ms. Rojas and Mrs. Conner, owners of the adjoining property with some concerns about encroachments and it was forwarded to the applicants' architects (attached). # Zucker Property, 12 Woodchuck Ct., Kent, NY; TM: 21.19-1-3

Mr. John Karell represented the applicants. Mr. Karell mentioned that there had been a meeting with the Planning Board consultants, the applicants and himself at the Monthly Review meeting. The bond estimate had been revised and submitted a bond estimate and asked that this be placed on the administrative track. The DEC permit is pending.

#### Mr. Barber's Comments (memo attached)

This project involves construction of expansions on an existing residence and a garage. There is also a Kent Wetland Permit required because there is an encroachment into the wetland buffer. The applicant proposes to install stormwater infiltration structures to pickup new impervious structures and untreated stormwater. The soil testing and percolation test results were submitted. The Board of Health sent a letter in February requesting details about the height of the area above the garage and details pertaining to an outdoor shower and hot tub adjacent to the garage. Mr. Karell said he had sent that information to the Board of Health. Mr. Barber said that there are just a few outstanding items to be addressed and recommended that this project be moved to an administrative track. The architectural plans were reviewed by the Building inspector and it was confirmed hat the bedroom count is still two.

#### Ms. Mangarillo's Comments (memo attached)

Ms. Mangarillo said that most of her comments had been addressed. The only remaining item is the bond in the amount of \$1,580.00 for the Erosion Control Bond and \$1,000.00 for the Wetland Mitigation Bond, which would be in effect for three years for the infiltration that's being used to offset the disturbances within the wetland buffer. Ms. Mangarillo recommended that the bonds be approved by the Planning Board and forwarded to the Town Board.

Mr. Lowes asked Mr. Karell if there were any legalities pertaining to the access driveway coming across the ajoining property. Mr. Karell said a letter had been provided that there was no issue with this matter. Ms. Mangarillo said that a note had been placed on the drawings regarding this.

Please be advised that the following pertinent documents have been reviewed pursuant to the above referenced application:

- Email correspondence from Robyn Niver of US Fish and Wildlife (New York Office) dated 06/18/19.
- Comment response memo prepared by Greene Lumber Co., undated and unsigned, 6 pages.

#### **Summary of Application:**

The subject property consist of a vacant 47.28 +/- acre parcel (lot 42) located on the southerly side of Peckslip Road in an R-40 zoning district and a vacant 3.26+/- acre parcel (lot 38) located on the southerly side of North Horsepound Road in an IOC zoning district. Lot 42 had obtained conditional subdivision approval from the Planning Board which has expired.

The applicant proposes to conduct a logging operation on both parcels. The total area to be logged is 47 acres (of the total area of 50.5 acres) and construction of the access road (from Peckslip Road) and landing area will disturb approximately 0.25 acres of the site. As a result, the applicant is requesting approval of an erosion and sediment control permit from the Planning Board.

#### **Environmental Review:**

#### Wetlands:

There are Town of Kent and NYSDEC jurisdictional wetlands/wetland buffer on both lots based on review of the conditionally approved subdivision plans. The above referenced maps do not accurately depict these areas and should be revised accordingly. Based on review of the above referenced maps, it appears that the tree harvest will include wetland and wetland buffer areas. As a result, it is recommended the Planning Board require the applicant to contact NYSDEC to obtain additional information regarding wetland delineation and possible permitting requirements. Wetland and wetland buffer crossings should be identified and based on additional information, a Town of Kent wetland permit from the Planning Board may be required. A site inspection by this office has not been conducted.

# Soils and Steep Slopes:

Soils consist predominately of Charlton-Chatfield and Hollis-Rock Outcrop. Approximately 50-60% of the proposed harvest area has slopes greater than 15%. The potential for erosion and sediment deposition is significant in these areas. The applicant has indicated that NYSDEC Best Forest Management practices will be used. This office defers to the Town Engineer for further review.

#### Trees:

The applicant proposes to log 47 of the 50.5 acres.

### Threatened and Endangered Species:

The applicant has provided information from US Fish and Wildlife via email. The project area consists primarily of upland forest in which sections of the site area above 900 feet in elevation. Although trees which fit the criteria for suitable roosting habitat are present within the project area, Indiana bats are not known to exist in New York State at elevations above 900'. Therefore it is unlikely that this forest management project will have an effect on Indiana bats. This has been supported by the above referenced email from US Fish and Wildlife.

However, there are sections of the site which are part of this application that are located below 900' in elevation. As a result, additional information and written verification from the US Fish and Wildlife New York office is required in order to ensure that their tree cutting restrictions are followed. To avoid direct impacts to Indiana bats it is recommended that all work comply with the US Fish and Wildlife Indiana Bat Project Review Fact Sheet – New York Field Office (March 2018).

#### Other:

Applicant has provided information regarding truck sizes/weights, number of truck trips per day, the truck traffic route(s) and hours of operation (include noise control information) which should be incorporated into an updated forest management plan.

Applicant should provide baseline information regarding the pre-action condition of the roads, bridges, drainage structures and other town infrastructure that will be used as a result of the proposed action and indicate how damage and repairs will be addressed prior to the completion of work. The applicant has indicated that he discussed the application

details with the Town Highway Superintendent and a site inspection would be conducted but nothing in writing has been provided.

Please indicate if a buffer can be maintained between the subject and adjoining properties that will not be subject to cutting.

This office defers to the Town Engineer regarding review of the erosion and sediment control plan and proposed engineering issues.

I reviewed the materials listed at the end of this memorandum; online mapping sources; and the Code of the Town of Kent, Chapter 77, Zoning. Based on my review I offer the following comments for the Board's consideration:

#### Summary

- 1. The proposal involves site plan; erosion control; and steep slope permit approvals for the construction of a self-storage facility and other uses. The plan proposes two self-storage buildings with office (management) and retail spaces, as well as parking areas, drive, utilities, and electric and stormwater management systems an approximately 2.7-acre site in the IOC (Industrial Office Commercial) zoning district.
- 2. My review is limited to the Zoning comments below. I defer to the Planning Board's Consulting Engineer and Environmental Consultant review for all other aspects of the project.

#### **SEQRA**

- 3. We have no comments on the Full Environmental Assessment Form (Full EAF). I defer to the Environmental Consultant for review of Full EAF section D. and E. pertaining to other aspects of the project. However, plan revisions are needed to address community character.
- 4. The proposal appears to be an Unlisted Action under the SEQRA.

#### Zoning & Site Plan

- 5. Clarify all aspects of the proposed business by showing the floor areas for office and retail areas; and truck rental in the 2-story building.
- 6. Submit a rendering of the site as viewed from the street, including buildings and retaining walls.
- 7. Revise the landscaping plan to add evergreens along the site's frontage, interspersed between the red oak trees.
- 8. As per Chapter 77-25.5, the code requires sidewalks with a four-foot tree lawn be installed on every public street. The applicant does not believe that this is necessary in this location. However, the sidewalk and tree lawn should be provided as per discussion at the June 13, 2019 Planning Board meeting.
- 9. Extensive lengths of retaining walls are proposed (~310' and 200'+), which will likely be visible from the site's frontage. Revise the plans regarding retaining walls as follows:

- a. The detail on sheet C-501 appears to depict a flat faced concrete wall. A more decorative wall must be provided.
- b. Submit elevations of the walls; and a rendering or illustration of the site as viewed from the street.
- c. Clarify the type of fence that will be on top of the wall and provide a detail.
- d. We defer to the consulting engineer regarding the potential for failure of the walls close to adjoining properties.
- 10. Move the sidewalk ramp in front of the 2-story building to line up with the end of the crosswalk.
- 11. Clarify the trash enclosure area as there appears to be an exit from the rear building leading into that area.
- 12. Regarding the zoning lot and bulk requirements table presented on plan sheet C-101, address the following:
  - a. The proposed 1-story storage building is a principle use; accordingly, there are no accessory structures on the site and that section should be deleted from the zoning schedule. Yet, the setback labels in the plan view should remain.
  - b. Clarify the meaning of the 74.2' setback label north of the gravel parking lot.
- 13. Provide detailed calculations for impervious surface areas on the site plan, including building footprints; parking areas; driveways and turning areas; and sidewalks.
- 14. Provide a lighting plan complying with zoning section 77-44.3. A. through D., and the following items:
  - a. As per Chapter 77-44.3. E.1 wall-mounted light fixtures shall not be mounted higher than 15 feet (15') above ground level; and free-standing fixtures within 50' of a residential property or district may not be higher than 15' and shall be full cutoff.
  - b. Show the matching lighting symbols in the plan view.
  - c. Show lighting location (pole- and wall-mounted), type, height, materials, color, whether full cut-off, etc. Dark bronze or textured dark bronze is the recommended finish.
  - d. Refer to details.
  - e. Provide a photometric plan with values extended to cover the entire site.
- 15. Regarding the architectural plans, address the following:
  - a. Provide the floor layout, including individual storage areas; and elevations for the 1-story building.
  - b. Provide the floor layout, including individual storage areas for the 2-story building.
  - c. Label areas in square feet (SF) for all uses.
  - d. Clarify whether the office space will have a counter or retail area.
  - e. Clarify what appears to be a room or counters off of the lobby space on the first floor.
- 16. Regarding any proposed signs, address the following:
  - a. While a free-standing sign is shown, clarify whether any wall sign is proposed.
  - b. Refer to the supplementary sign regulations, Zoning, Article X generally; and specifically, the requirements in section 77-37., Signs in nonresidential districts.
  - c. Revise the plans to include all aspects of proposed signs, their locations, design, dimensions, height, size (area), materials, colors, lighting, etc.
- 17. Provide a tabular summary of permitted and proposed sign areas per section 77-37 A. (2) and (3) requirements. Signage will be reviewed in detail later.

New or supplementary comments are shown in **bold**.

The subject Erosion and Sediment Control Plan is not approved. The following comments are provided for the Planning Board's consideration dated June 12, 2019:

- 1. The proposed project is within the NYCDEP East of Hudson watershed and will disturb more than 5,000 SF of land. A Town of Kent Erosion & Sediment Control Permit is required for the access road and landing area. However coverage under NYSDEC SPDES General Permit for Stormwater Discharges from Construction Activity, GP-0-15-002 is not required as NYSDEC considers all silvicultural work exempt from the requirements GP-0-15-002.
- Per conversation with Richard Othmer, Jr. Highway Superintendent, he is doing a major. replacement, repair and repaving of Horsepound Rd this summer. He has requested logging trucks/equipment avoid the use of Horsepound Rd and use Barrett Hill to Route 52. The intersection of Barrett Hill with Route 52 is very steep. Extra precautions will be needed for larger trucks to turn onto Route 52. Extra precautions to be considered should include, but not limited to, having a flagger to control traffic as needed, providing caution signs on Route 52 to alert drivers and education or signage for the logging truck drivers to be aware of steep road. - A note has been added to the "Erosion Control Plan" to consult with Richard Othmer, Jr.

- 3. Provide notes that any sediment that is tracked onto public roads, Rhinebeck Rd and beyond, will be removed. -Completed. A note has been added to "Erosion Control Plan".
- 4. During the Planning Board Workshop, the applicant's representative indicated that some drainage diversion work will be done to reduce runoff flowing onto Rhinebeck Rd. Please provide an updated drawing with the approximate location and notes that the diversion is to remain in place after the timber harvest is complete.
- 5. An erosion control bond is required. For other projects by NYCDEP in Kent, the Town of Kent has accepted a letter of assurance from NYCDEP in lieu of a cash bond. This was done for the Seven Hills Lake Dam Repair. Please have NYCDEP provide a similar letter for the Planning Board to consider.
- 6. The applicant is responsible for full payment of actual costs of erosion control inspections. An initial inspection fee deposit of \$1000 is to be paid to the Town in accordance with the Town of Kent Fee Schedule.
- 7. We defer to the Planning Board's environmental consultant regarding wetland issues.

A site inspection was conducted on May 20, 2019.

#### **Summary of Application:**

The subject application is a salvage of down trees in a 24 acre area which was damaged due to the action of the micro bursts experienced in the area in 2018 as well as a crown harvest and thinning of approximately 56 acres of the subject site.

The total area of disturbance is greater than 5,000 square feet and as a result, the applicant is requesting approval of an erosion and sediment control permit from the Planning Board.

#### **Environmental Review:**

#### Wetlands:

There are Town of Kent and NYSDEC jurisdictional wetlands/wetland buffer on the parcels, The applicant is proposing to cross two, narrow areas of intermittent

watercourses by spanning the areas with temporary crossing structures. There is no proposed disturbance to the wetlands and limited disturbance to jurisdictional buffers. The forest management plan should provide details of the proposed crossings. A Town of Kent wetland permit is not required for the proposed action.

### Soils and Steep Slopes:

Soils consist predominately of Charlton-Chatfield and Hollis-Rock Outcrop. A substantial area of the site has slopes greater than 15% and there are large areas of exposed rock outcrop. The proposed areas of activity are limited to only small areas of the site in which slopes are greater than 15%. The applicant proposes to use NYSDEC Best Forest Management Planning for erosion and sediment control and also proposes to leave in place erosion measures which will reduce an existing flooding condition. Consultation with the Town Highway Superintendent is suggested.

#### Other:

The applicant should meet with the Town Highway Superintendent to discuss truck traffic routing as it has been indicated that there are plans to pave Horsepound Road.

Applicant should provide baseline information regarding the pre-action condition of the roads, bridges, drainage structures and other town infrastructure that will be used as a result of the proposed action and indicate how damage and repairs will be addressed prior to the completion of work. Referral to the town Highway Superintendent is recommended.

The location of the subject site should be corrected on the heading of the NYCDEP letter.

At your request I have reviewed the Site Plan Submission #2 for the above project, with revisions through 2/19/19. My review was focused on compliance with the 2015 edition of the International Fire Code, including Appendix D, as adopted by New York State in its 2017 Uniform Code Supplement.

The project consists of a 2-story addition to an existing 3-story facility, the latter of which has a height indicated on the drawings as "40 ft  $\pm$ ". Although the current zoning allows a maximum building height of 2-1/2 stories or 30 ft, it is assumed that the height of the existing facility is grandfathered. For purposes of applying code-mandated fire department access provisions, however, this analysis recognizes the existing building height. The gross building area of the completed facility is scheduled to be 79,706 sq ft.

Based on the project location, the Lake Carmel Fire Department will be the agency responsible for emergency response.

#### Building Code Issues

Although building code issues are outside the scope of this review, some commentary is appropriate since there are building code matters that require approval of the fire code official or fire chief. The existing facility is protected with an automatic fire sprinkler system, and the new addition will likewise be required to be protected with an automatic sprinkler system meeting the requirements of national installation standard NFPA 13 – Installation of Sprinkler Systems.

It should be noted that this will include a requirement for sprinkler protection of the parking area located beneath part of the building. Although NFPA 13 allows omission of sprinklers below portecocheres and similar situations involving only transient parking, this space does not qualify for such omission. It will be necessary to extend dry pendent sprinklers below the ceiling of the parking area, or protect the area with a separate dry pipe sprinkler system. Residential areas above the parking area cannot be protected with a standard dry pipe sprinkler system due to the time delay associated with water delivery to the fire.

# Fire Department Connection

Under the terms of both the building code and the fire code (Section 912.4) immediate access to the fire department connection (FDC) that can be used to support the sprinkler system must be maintained at all times and without obstruction by fences, bushes, trees, walls, or any other fixed or movable object. The access to the FDC, and therefore location of the FDC, must be approved by

## Fire Apparatus Access

Section D104.1 requires buildings exceeding 30 ft in height to have "at least two means of fire apparatus access for each structure. Section D104.2 requires "two separate and approved fire apparatus access roads" for facilities having a gross building area of more than 62.000 sq ft. An exception to D 104.2 allows a single approved fire apparatus access road for projects having a gross building area up to 124,000 sq ft when all buildings are equipped throughout with approved automatic sprinkler systems. As such, D104.1 applies for this project, but D104.2 does not, meaning that two separate access roads are not required provided that each structure can be accessed from two different directions. The proposed provision of access roads on both the north and south sides of the facility appears to satisfy this requirement.

# Aerial Fire Apparatus Access Roads

Section D105 addresses aerial fire apparatus access, which is required where the vertical distance between the grade plane and the highest roof surface exceeds 30 ft. The section reads as follows:

# SECTION D105 - AERIAL FIRE APPARATUS ACCESS ROADS

- DI05.1 Where the vertical distance between the grade plane and the highest roof surface exceeds 30 feet. approved aerial fire apparatus access roads shall be provided. For purposes of this section, the highest roof surface shall be determined by measurement to the eave of a pitched roof, the intersection of the roof to the exterior wall. or the top of parapet walls, whichever is greater.
- D105.2 Aerial fire apparatus access roads shall have a minimum unobstructed width of 26 feet, exclusive of shoulders, in the immediate vicinity of the building or portion thereof.
- DI05.3 At least one of the required access routes meeting this condition shall be located within a minimum of 15 feet and a maximum of 30 feet from the building, and shall be positioned parallel to one entire side of the building. The side of the building on which the aerial fire apparatus access road is positioned shall be approved by the fire code official.
- DI05.4 Overhead utility and power lines shall not be located over the aerial fire apparatus access road or between the aerial fire apparatus road and the building. Other obstructions shall be permitted to be placed with the

#### Construction of Access Roads

Section D102.1 requires that fire apparatus access roads must have an asphalt, concrete or other approved (by the fire code official) driving surface capable of supporting the imposed load of fire apparatus weighing at least 75,000 pounds. The current site plan is not in compliance with these requirements, since it indicates use of existing and new gravel access roads. Specifications for the proposed construction of all access roads showing conformance with the fire code requirements, should be submitted for the approval of the Planning Board's engineering consultant.

#### Turnarounds for Access Roads

Table D103.4 requires that dead-end access roads between 501 and 750 ft in length be at least 26 ft in width and be provided with a 120-ft hammerhead, 60-ft "Y" or 96-ft diameter cul-de-sac to allow for turnarounds. The current site plan shows a dead-end access road to the south that is approximately 600 ft in length and is **not in compliance** with these requirements.

The dead-end access road to the north is approximately 350 ft in length. For a length between 151 and 500 ft, Table D103.4 requires the same design of turnarounds, but with a minimum width of 20 ft. The current site plan is **not in compliance**.

Signage for Access Roads

"NO PARKING - FIRE LANE" signs must be provided in conformance with Section D103.6 as required by the fire code official.

At your request I have reviewed the revised site plan submission for the above project, sent to me by project architect P. W. Scott on 5/28/19. My review was focused on compliance with the 2015 edition of the International Fire Code, including Appendix D, as adopted by New York State in its 2017 Uniform Code Supplement.

The project consists of a number of individual buildings, including two hotels, a conference center, truck stop and water park, placed on an extremely large and irregular site. I had previously discussed the project with the Planning Board at a workshop earlier this year, and had also advised the project architect of my observations that the original site plan was non-compliant with regard to fire apparatus access roads. The proposed access arrangements have subsequently been revised.

Based on the project location, the Lake Carmel Fire Department will be the agency responsible for emergency response.

#### Fire Apparatus Access Roads

Section D104.1 requires buildings exceeding 30 ft in height to have "at least two means of fire apparatus access for each structure. Section D104.2 requires "two separate and approved fire apparatus access roads" for facilities having a gross building area of more than 62,000 sq ft. An exception to D 104.2 allows a single approved fire apparatus access road for projects having a gross building area up to 124,000 sq ft when all buildings are equipped throughout with approved automatic sprinkler systems. Although the buildings on this site will be required to be protected with automatic sprinkler systems in order to conform to the Building Code, the project exceeds the 124,000 sq ft threshold to allow the exception. As such, both D104.1 and D104.2 apply for this project, meaning that two separate access roads are required.

Section D104.3 includes a requirement for remoteness of the two access roads, calling for them to be placed a minimum distance apart of "not less than one half the length of the maximum overall diagonal dimension of the property or area to be served, measured in a straight line between accesses."

The irregular shape of the property and the fact that much of it will not be used for the building complex makes it difficult to determine the minimum distance between access roads. Mr. Scott has proposed defining the "area to be served" as the distance from the edge of the parking lot at the

Radisson hotel in the northeast corner of the complex to the edge of the parking lot at the truck stop on the southwest corner of the complex, a distance of 1882 linear feet. Half of this distance would be 941 ft.

As originally proposed the centerline distance between access roads at the north and south ends of the site was 860 ft, which was inadequate. As such, the revised site plan includes an additional emergency access road about 90 ft to the north of the main entrance to the complex, providing a separation distance of approximately 950 ft between this emergency access road and the truck stop entrance to the south. The addition of an emergency access road from the truck stop plaza to the main building complex then satisfies the requirement for two remote fire apparatus access roads.

I consider this to be an acceptable means of meeting the code requirement.

#### Aerial Fire Apparatus Access Roads

Section D105 addresses aerial fire apparatus access, which is required where the vertical distance between the grade plane and the highest roof surface exceeds 30 ft. The section reads as follows:

# SECTION D105 - AERIAL FIRE APPARATUS ACCESS ROADS

- DI05.1 Where the vertical distance between the grade plane and the highest roof surface exceeds 30 feet, approved aerial fire apparatus access roads shall be provided. For purposes of this section, the highest roof surface shall be determined by measurement to the eave of a pitched roof, the intersection of the roof to the exterior wall, or the top of parapet walls, whichever is greater.
- D105.2 Aerial fire apparatus access roads shall have a minimum unobstructed width of 26 feet, exclusive of shoulders, in the immediate vicinity of the building or portion thereof.
- DI05.3 At least one of the required access routes meeting this condition shall be located within a minimum of 15 feet and a maximum of 30 feet from the building, and shall be positioned parallel to one entire side of the building. The side of the building on which the aerial fire apparatus access road is positioned shall be approved by the fire code official.
- DI05.4 Overhead utility and power lines shall not be located over the aerial fire apparatus access road or between the aerial fire apparatus road and the building. Other obstructions shall be permitted to be placed with the approval of the fire code official.

As originally proposed, the site plan was not in compliance. P.W. Scott has indicated that revisions made to the site plan conform to these requirements by moving the parking away from the tall buildings, and with the width of access roads increased to 26 ft.

#### Construction of Access Roads

Section D103.2 limits the grade of fire apparatus access roads to 10 per cent unless otherwise approved by the fire chief. P.W. Scott has indicated grades do not exceed 9 percent.

Section D102.1 requires that fire apparatus access roads must have an asphalt, concrete or other approved (by the fire code official) driving surface capable of supporting the imposed load of fire apparatus weighing at least 75,000 pounds. P.W. Scott has indicated the cover will be asphalt tailings over compacted item #4, considered pervious by NYCDEP for stormwater purposes. The

Planning Board's engineering consultant should be asked to review final specifications and confirm that this will be able to meet the required loading.

#### Fire Hydrants

Section 507.5.1 of the fire code states that on-site fire hydrants "shall be provided where required by the fire code official." It is appropriate for a large building complex like this to have such features. Because the buildings are fully sprinklered, a distance of up to 600 ft to a hydrant from any building would be allowed as the basis of spacing.

P.W. Scott has indicated that onsite fire hydrants will be provided in accordance with NFPA 1142, supplied from tanks located at the elevated south end of the property. In addition, a dry hydrant will be located at the first pond along the main access road, with an available volume of 500,000 gallons at a depth of 6 ft.

### Fire Department Connections

Under the terms of both the building code and the fire code (Section 912.4) immediate access to the fire department connections (FDC) that can be used to support the sprinkler systems must be maintained at all times and without obstruction by fences, bushes, trees, walls, or any other fixed or movable object. The accesses to the FDCs, and therefore locations of the FDCs, must be approved by the fire chief.

#### Signage for Access Roads

"NO PARKING - FIRE LANE" signs must be provided in conformance with Section D103.6 as required by the fire code official.

The following comments are provided for the Planning Board's consideration from a memo dated March 13, 2019:

1. The proposed project is within the NYCDEP East of Hudson watershed, however the current estimate for area of disturbance is less than the threshold of 5,000 SF. As long

as the area of disturbance remains less than 5,000 SF then coverage under NYSDEC SPDES General Permit for Stormwater Discharges from Construction Activity, GP-0-15-002 is NOT required.

However, since steep slopes will be disturbed and a wetland buffer is expected to be disturbed, a Town of Kent Erosion & Sediment Control Permit is required.

- 7. A bond estimate of \$520.00 was included with the submittal. We do not recommend this bond estimate be accepted for the bond amount and recommended for approval by the Town Board until additional discussion and analysis is completed.
  - a. 6/12/2019 A revised bond estimate that includes the infiltration systems has been provided for \$2,520.00. The bond estimate indicates 2000 SF of seed and mulch. Based on the areas provided on the drawing, this quantity is to be increased to 3000 SF. Additional wetland mitigation may also require bonding, which could be a separate bond or be added to the erosion control bond. We defer to Bruce Barber regarding potential bonding for wetland buffer disturbance mitigation. At this time, we do not recommend acceptance of the bond amount.
  - **b.** 7/11/2019 A revised bond estimate that includes the infiltration systems has been provided for \$2,580.00. Based on discussion with Bruce Barber, we recommend the bond amount be split into 2 bonds, 1 for erosion control and the other for wetland mitigation. The infiltration practices serve as wetland mitigation for disturbance in the wetland buffer. We recommend the following to be accepted and recommended for approval by the Town Board:
    - i. \$1580 for the erosion control bond, and
    - ii. \$1000 for the wetland mitigation bond.
- 8. The applicant is responsible for full payment of actual costs of erosion control inspections. An initial inspection fee deposit of \$1000 is to be paid to the Town in accordance with the Town of Kent Fee Schedule. acknowledged.
- 10. We defer to the Planning Board's environmental consultant regarding wetland issues.

Application is to construct an addition, a garage with deck, outdoor tub and shower, and screened porch within an existing deck footprint to renovate an existing two bedroom 2,058 square foot single-family residence on a 1.0+/- acre parcel in an R-80 zoning district.

Total site disturbance is indicated as 4,924 square feet. Additions total 2,138 square feet.

#### **Environmental Review:**

Wetlands:

The applicant has delineated wetlands located immediately adjacent to the subject parcel. The wetland buffer from the wetlands is reflected onto the subject property and there is

proposed disturbance in the wetland buffer in the amount of 1,617 square feet.

A site inspection was conducted and the delineation was found to be in in compliance with Chapter 39A of the Town of Kent Town Code. A Town of Kent wetland permit will be required from the Planning Board. The applicant is proposing the installation of stormwater infiltration structures which will capture runoff from the proposed as well as areas of presently untreated runoff. A New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) wetland permit is pending.

Trees:

One tree is proposed to be cut.

Topography/Soils:

Applicant has not provided a soils map. Approximately 658 square feet of the proposed disturbance is located in areas of slope greater than 15%. This office defers to the Town Engineer regarding the erosion and sediment control plan.

Threatened Species:

Tree cutting in this area is restricted due to US Fish and Wildlife preservation directives for the Indiana and Long-eared bats. The applicant has provided a note indication compliance with tree cutting restrictions.

#### Review:

Plan sheet S-1:

Connections of the proposed outdoor bathtub and shower to the house piping are shown. It is unclear if the PCDOH has approved these connections or the height of the space above the garage (see PCDOH letter dated 2/21/19).

Please show overflow and discharge connections for the hot tub to the infiltration structure.

Indicate electrical fixtures and connections within limits of disturbance.

Indicate if there shall be any net changes in the existing number of bedrooms (see PCDOH letter dated 2/21/19).

Architectural Plans:

The actual proposed (including potential) bedroom count should be

verified by the Town Building Inspector.

This office defers to the Planning Board Engineer regarding site and drainage design.
