Purpose: The purpose of this call was to introduce the proposed mitigation strategies, provide a summary of the pilot project, discuss concerns regarding treatment options and conflicts with any existing treatment plans for Lake Carmel, identify potential permitting requirements, and receive feedback from stakeholders.

NYS DEC

NYS DEC DOW began with an overview of the proposed project to implement two Harmful Algal Bloom (HAB) mitigation strategies (i.e. hydrogen peroxide, ultrasonic device) on Lake Carmel, including the following:

- Background information on the Governor's HAB Initiative and the task to explore HAB mitigation strategies
- How waterbodies susceptible to HABs were identified and selected for pilot projects based on DEC historical data and Princeton Hydro recommendations
- Impact of proposed treatments on algal communities within a waterbody
- Historical use of proposed treatments in NYS and ongoing work with these strategies

Princeton Hydro

Princeton Hydro provided a summary of the pilot treatment applications on Lake Carmel. Four Beaches will be identified (three regulated bathing beach treatments, one nonregulated bathing beach control) as suitable candidates for the pilot: two beaches will receive hydrogen peroxide treatment a.k.a. GreenClean Granular Algaecide, one beach will have an ultrasonic device deployed, and the final beach area will serve as a control to indicate overall lake conditions. Water quality monitoring will take place every other week. The ultrasonic device will be one of the smaller options available, will need a nearby GFCI protected 110V or greater power source drawing a low amperage, and can effectively treat 650ft away per manufacturer specifications, as measured from a small buoy (max 2ft x 2ft float) outside the swimming areas. The power line would run continuously upon startup, would be trenched to the lake, and then encased in a PVC pipe within the water, using systems commonly deployed by Princeton Hydro in aeration devices installed in other waterbodies.

NYC DEP

NYC DEP provided a summary of the two ultrasonic deployment projects proposed for Croton Falls and New Croton Reservoir during 2018. In each study, there will be a treatment location and a control

location, at which water quality monitoring will occur. The devices to be used are solar powered, treat approximately 124 acres, and are substantially larger than the device proposed for deployment in Lake Carmel. Necessary permitting applications have been submitted by NYC DEP. Permits need to be secured from DEC for the platforms housing the solar panels powering the devices, and from OPRHP for the buoys from which the ultrasonic devices are tethered. NYCDEP is awaiting potential permit (monitoring) conditions and final approval from DEC.

Town of Kent

Town of Kent Town Board allocated resources this year for the use of algaecide treatments on Lake Carmel. Two permits have been issued for the use of Cutrine Plus and Copper Sulfate on the waterbody. Historically, Cutrine Plus is applied to the entire lake in a series of two treatments (1/2 lake sections on different days), preemptively to curb algal growth. Copper Sulfate is then used to spot treat or shock specific areas of the lake if a bloom occurs. The applicator is LIFE Inc. based in Dutchess County.

Concerns

- 1) Coinciding treatments of Cutrine Plus and/or Copper Sulfate with the pilot project strategies.
- 2) Use of electricity at a regulated bathing beach and complying with SSC Subpart 6-2 requirements.
- 3) Implications of treating with ultrasonic 24/7 and any potential release of cyanotoxins in the water at the regulated bathing beach.
- 4) Identifying beaches (2-3 acres in size) at which the proposed treatment will be suitable and will work logistically.

Next Steps – Action Items

- 1) Meeting between Princeton Hydro, Town of Kent, NYSDEC, etc. to coordinate treatment areas and schedules planned for 2018 (#1).
- 2) Meeting with NYSDOH, NYSDEC, Princeton Hydro, Putnam CHD, etc. to discuss public health and safety concerns noted above (#2 and #3).
 - a. Potential to expand water quality monitoring
 - b. Assurances needed that electrocution concerns are adequately addressed
- 3) Princeton Hydro, NYSDEC DOW, Putnam CHD, DEC Regional Staff, etc. to meet on Lake Carmel to discuss logistics and scope out beaches in-person on **May 15, 2018 at 09:30AM** (#4).
- 4) Princeton Hydro, NYSDEC DOW will draft a work plan outlining the pilot project.
- 5) Princeton Hydro, NYSDEC DOW will work with DEC Regional Staff to obtain appropriate permits.

As per our discussion over the past few weeks, I have been in contact with three local fence work companies regarding proposals for fencing to enclose our new playground at the town center. It was asked that all companies give us quotes on encompassing the entire 75' x 75' area in a 4 foot high black aluminum fence with two gates, and that they also factor into their pricing drilling through asphalt and ledge during the installation process. Attached please find the three proposals we received back.

After reviewing these proposals it is my recommendation that we accept that of Duke Fence. They came in with the second lowest price just \$100 higher than the lowest, but given their ability to complete the installation sooner than the other companies and the exemplary and exceptional work they have done for us in the past, I believe they offer us the best value on this project.
