Resolution #280- Exemption from Sewer District TM#33.18-1-15 - Schwartz

On a motion by Councilwoman Osborn Seconded by Supervisor Fleming

WHEREAS, the Town of Kent is in receipt of a letter from Bradley Schwartz and Michael Schwartz, the owners of the premises identified as Tax Map No. 33.18-1-15, located along Route 52 and Nichols Lane and having a mailing address at 405 Route 52, which is a commercial property located within the C (Commercial) District of the Town of Kent, New York (the "Property"), a copy of which letter is annexed hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, by their letter, Bradley and Michael Schwartz request that their Property be exempted from connection to the Kent Sewer District, because they Property has a septic system which is compliant with the Department of Environmental Protection of the City of New York, which compliance resulted on modified building plans and additional building costs in connection with the development of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Kent has considered the annexed request;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Kent hereby denies the request of Bradley and Michael Schwartz to exempt 405 Route 52 in the Town of Kent from connection to the Kent Sewer District.

Upon roll call vote:

<u>Councilman Denbaum</u> – The sewer district committee was against this request. He has gone with the sewer district's recommendation even though he was unsure. For two reasons be believes the request should be granted. He will be voting nay for the denial. The reason being the sewer district committee is set up to build the commercial sector on Route 52 and to alleviate any environmental issues associated with failing septic's. In this instance, the commercial building will be there whether the exemption is granted or not, it will be part of the community the requirements DEP put in place has given the assurance that we are up to the best environmental standards possible. He sees no negative, we will not lose a commercial property, he voted no to deny the exemption.

<u>Councilwoman Osborn</u> – aye, she feels it is important to not give exemptions, every time we do someone picks up the slack and does not think it fair to the others involved in the sewer district.

Councilman Huestis - nay

<u>Councilman Tierney</u> – aye, to deny the exemption, the septic system may be working today, and may fail in the future, if that happens there may not be an allotment available to help that building. He wants them to remain in the sewer district.

<u>Supervisor Fleming</u> – aye to deny the exemption, there is a requirement if a sewer line is available, the people in the district have to tie into it, that's not just our requirement but county wide. Although she has sympathy for this business, the only exemptions she has voted to approve are properties she believes were not actually on Route 52. This property is commercial property, certainly within the district. She has sympathy and had sympathy for the family that did not have a commercial property, but having financial difficulty, she felt obligated to deny that exemption because it was on the Route 52 corridor. Other than a mistake of fact including them, there was no reason to exclude them, and voted to deny. Motion carried
