A regular meeting was held at 7:00 P.M. at the Kent Town Hall, 25 Sybil's Crossing, Kent Lakes, New York.

Presentation – George Fischer Middle School Go Green Club

Deputy Supervisor Lou Tartaro stated the he is speaking for the entire Town Board when he says he is very proud of the effort that went into the Fire Tower mural project. All too often, all we hear and read about is the troubles and mischief that young people get into. The concept for the mural project came about due to vandalism at the Tower caused primarily by teens making poor decisions. It is a real pleasure to recognize the positive efforts and enjoy the art work created by these George Fischer Middle School students. Before he acknowledge the artists whose work is on display, he recognized the 2 teachers who sponsored the Go Green Club that being Amanda O'Shaughnessy and Jayne Chiappone. Before he asked Ms. O'Shaughnessy to help distribute the actual certificates from the Town of Kent, he read a proclamation from the County Executive Mary Ellen O'Dell, "Congratulations to the members of George Fischer Middle School Go Green Club on their outstanding work in creating 4 colorful painted panels, each depicting a different season of the year along with depictions of the local wildlife and habitats that are found within Putnam County. Your project of cooperative venture to assist the Kent Conservation Advisory Committee in the restoration of the Mt. Nimhan Fire Tower in Kent is a testament to your wonderful artistic abilities and deep sense of the natural world that surrounds you here in Putnam. Congratulations also to the Go Green Club Co-Advisory, Amanda O'Shaughnessy and Jayne Chiappone for overseeing the 25 week project and to the Kent CAC Chairwoman, Beth Herr and members of the Kent CAC who acts as caretakers of the historic 85 foot tower." Ms. O'Shaughnessy assisted Deputy Supervisor Tartaro to distribute the Certificates. He also presented her with the Putnam County Proclamation from Mary Ellen O'Dell. He stated there were 13 participants, 5 are in attendance and presented Annalisa Fusco, Lany Durkee, Steven Mount, Shalla Mulous and Lidia Ruben. All applauded.

Public Hearing – Taxi & Livery

Town Clerk, Cappelli read the Public Notice, see attached. Town Counsel Curtiss stated this was discussed a while ago. The Town tweaked this statute that the Kent Police Department is going to enforce it and if there is any property left in the cab it would not go to the Sheriff's Department but back to the Kent Police Department to claim. The Town did two other tweaks the drivers have to keep trip sheets so we know what they are doing narrowing down hours of operations and no honking when they pick up a fare. Supervisor Doherty added they have to get a special permit from Bill Looney the Zoning Enforcement Officer who is in charge of enforcing it.

Supervisor Doherty asked for comments. Bill Nulk, President of the Chamber of Commerce agreed with the overall statute it is a proper improvement application and change. But to clarify the reporting aspects, if an incident happens outside the Town of Kent, they will report it to the jurisdiction it happens in, in speaking to Police Chief DiVernieri, he stated if they did report it to the Town of Kent, it would be sent to the proper jurisdiction. The other thing is the County Transportation Task Force recommendation No. 24 specifically says that an agency or sub department, board, etc. should be established to regulate the operations of taxi cab, limousines, shuttles and buses for the safety and protection of the citizens and for the better coordination of the services in our region. In that recommendation, it specifies the fact the Towns of Kent, Patterson and the Village of Brewster already have existing ordinances that have some of these specifications that would not necessarily be included in any kind of overall program. Supervisor Doherty stated the County would maybe licensed all the taxis and work with Westchester County because many taxi's were getting tickets. Mr. Nulk said reciprocity with Westchester County and other jurisdictions is very important for limousines especially for access to airports and other things. This is something they are concerned about and the County is

going to be moving forward with that. Supervisor Doherty asked if there were any other comments or questions. There were none.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Kent hereby adopts Local Law No. 2 of 2013 amending Sections 47-6 and 47-9 of Chapter 47 of the Kent Code entitled "Livery and Taxicab Services" in the form and manner as provided in the attached; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Local Law No. 2 of 2013 of the Town of Kent is hereby enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Kent as Local Law No. 2 of 2013 of the Town of Kent; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this local law shall take effect immediately upon filing

with this State's Secretary of State.

§ 47-6 Conditions to approval of permit

Sections 47-6(A), (B) and (C) shall remain in full force and effect.

D. Each lot for which a special use permit may be issued shall have thereon a single-family residence which shall be either owned by the owner/operator of the vehicle used in the livery service or taxi cab service or the owner/operator shall be the lawful tenant of the property.

Sections 47-6(E) and (F) shall remain in full force and effect.

G. Any application for a special use permit under this Chapter shall be accompanied by a fee of \$75.00.

§ 47-9 Operating Standards

The following operating standards shall be a condition of the special permit approved for the operation of a taxi cab service.

A. Each taxi cab driver shall, upon the request of the passenger making payment, and upon receipt of full payment for the authorized fare, give a receipt to the passenger making the payment.

B. Taxi cab drivers may not carry any additional riders other than the first fare employing the cab without the permission of the first fare employing the cab.

C. The use of the vehicle horn for the purpose of notifying a fare of the arrival of the taxi shall not be permitted between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. The use of the vehicle horn during any other times shall be a violation of this chapter.

D. The operator of the taxi shall maintain complete vehicle trip sheets which shall include:

- (1) The name and driver's license number of each driver operating the vehicle;
- (2) The date, start time in hour and minutes, and place of origin of each trip for each passenger;
- (3) The time and location of the drop-off location;
- (4) The fare and trip charged for each passenger \and trip;
- (5) The date, time, location and description of any accident or breakdown;

(6) Any citation or violation issued regarding the taxi cab or the conduct of driver.

E. Trip sheets must be provided to any police officer upon demand.

F. Trip sheets must be kept on file and made available for audit, examination or inspection for two years.

G. The owner/operator of the taxi cab shall not dismiss, discharge, or otherwise require any passenger to leave the taxi cab other than at the passenger's requested destination without cause. For this purpose, "cause" means the taxi cab has become disabled or the passenger has become disorderly or has refused to pay the authorized fare. A driver who requires a passenger to leave the taxi cab other than at the passenger's requested destination shall do so only at a well-lit public place or, if the taxicab has become disabled, to another taxi cab and shall immediately notify the Town of Kent Police Department of all the details of the incident.

H. Any property left by a passenger in the taxi cab shall be held by the driver for not less than 30 days and shall be returned to the passenger as soon as reasonably possible, but in any event, within 24 hours after its discovery, said property shall be surrendered to the Town of Kent Police Department.

I. No vehicle cleaning, maintenance or repairs shall be conducted on a residential lot for which a special use permit has been issued between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.

J. No individual other than the property owner or his or her immediate family member shall loiter in, at or near the vehicle waiting for service calls.

K. All special use permits shall be granted by the Zoning Code Enforcement Officer.

All remaining Sections of Chapter 47 shall remain in full force and effect.
