#### **TOWN BOARD MEETING OCTOBER 3, 2023**

At 7:00 p.m. Supervisor McGlasson called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **Crest Funding**

Councilwoman Campbell explained the board agreed on one project the Daniel Nimham Statue for the 2022 funding. Additional data gathering is needed for the other projects.

### **Energy Benchmarking**

Councilwoman Campbell said this program is through NYSERDA where the Hudson Regional Counsel will provide assistance to do energy benchmarking for our buildings. It is a climate smart activity and will get the town to the threshold to obtain the \$5,000 grant as three other energy saving activities that fall under NYSERDA criteria. She explained we provide the energy bills and Hudson Regional Counsel will do the calculations for up to 4 buildings over a certain size. A resolution will be brought to the next meeting.

## Resolution #315 - Accepting Erosion Control Surety Bond & Escrow for Inspection Fee
